THE PARADE

The Pied Piper's Parade kicked off the celebration and is always great fun — to watch or be in! This year's parade, organized by Pete Carruthers (Shadowmoor) and Edith Hambie (Park Dr), was led by the "Pied Piper" and a portion of the Decatur High Band. Commissioners Bill Mealor, Marion Cunningham, Candler Broom, and Ted O'Callaghan rode in the parade, Ed Legge played the drum, Garland Hart the fife, neighborhood groups decorated floats and lots of folks just joined in the fun.

Oakhurst Community Health Center

Oakhurst Community Health Center is encouraging well child assessments for children at regular intervals. A well child assessment includes a physical examination, urine and blood tests when needed, hearing and vision screening, developmental screening, dental screening and nutritional assessment.

Regular well child assessments help to prevent health problems. By identifying health problems early through regular well child assessments, treatment can be started earlier. Well child assessments for your child can give you the assurance that your child is physically and emotionally healthy and is developing normally.

During the teen years (13-19) we recommend that children be seen for yearly examinations. In addition to the physical examination, psychological screening and health education are available. A blood test, urine test and test for tuberculosis are done when needed. Vision and hearing screening are provided. An immunization for tetanus is given at 15 or 16 years if not given in the past 10 years.

If you would like your child to have a well child assessment at the Health Center, please call 377-6448. Our sliding fee system is applied to the cost of a well child visit when appropriate.

IMMUNIZATION SCHEDULE

| Age | Immunization |

| 1-4 wks | Well baby assessment |
| 2 mos. | DTP, Polio |
| 4 mos. | DPT, Polio |
| 6 mos. | DPT |
| 12 mos. | TB test |
| 15 mos. | Measles, Mumps, Rubella |
| 18 mos. | DPT, Polio |
| 2 yrs | Well child assessment |
| 3 yrs. | TB Test |
| 4-6 yrs. | DPT, Polio |
| 7-9 yrs | Well child assessment |
| 10-12 yrs. | TB Test |

(Note: at the time of immunization indicated above, the child should also receive a well child assessment and nutrition counselling)
