

## OLDFIELD RD. TO JOIN DECATUR?

While many cities have to fight to expand their boundaries, Decatur, even with its taxes, is proving a popular place to live. So popular is Winnona Park that ten or twelve families living on Oldfield Road have asked to be annexed into the City of Decatur. See map below.

The annexation was proposed by several families on McKinnon and Oldfield who were paying tuition to send their children to Winnona Park Elementary School. Tuition works fine as long as there's space, but children outside the city can get bumped by city residents -- even on the day school opens. To solve this problem, several families proposed annexation of their streets into Decatur. Contacted by these families, Representative Eleanor Richardson agreed to sponsor a bill in the legislature if 80% of the families on the streets agreed. McKinnon failed to get the 80% but a portion of Oldfield next to Decatur did get the required per centage and such a bill was introduced.

As local legislation it had to be approved by 2/3 of the DeKalb House and Senate members. Presented to the DeKalb delegation by Thad Godwin (Oldfield), the bill was approved and presented to the full legislature. Here it passed a "courtesy" vote (once it is approved by 2/3 of the county's delegation, it is usually approved as a courtesy by the other legislators). Now it awaits any objections by the Justice Department (it has to be approved there since it affects voting rights). If approved, a portion of Oldfield Road will become a part of Decatur and WPNA's boundaries (and hopefully its volunteers!) will be expanded.






# SEED & FEED MARCHING ABOMINABLES TO PERFORM

The Seed & Feed Marching Abominable was founded in 1974 (part of Kelly's Seed & Feed Theatre) as an old-fashion ragtag street band. Since then, the band has performed all over: at Hawks and Braves games, birthday parties, MARTA stations, conventions, Snellville Day, Piedmont and Inman festivals, on TV, in Symphony Hall, at children's events, old folks homes, saloons, jugglers' conventions, and at the head of the St. Patrick's Day parage. The band is a special favorite with children of all ages.

The band, led by musical director L.A. Tuten, will present a program of old-time march tunes (Sousa and others), Dixieland, and swing standards such as "Tuxedo Junction" and "String of Pearls". Novelty numbers are to be expected from this assemblage of musicians and trombone-players.

### anti-highway petition a success

Almost 400 Winnona Park residents signed a petition expressing strong opposition to construction of any east-west thoroughfare through Decatur and urging Decatur commissioners to reaffirm their opposition to any such plans.

According to Jo Deck, president of WPNA, the nearly 400 petitioners represented a sampling of streets in our neighborhood by WPNA to get a community response to a proposed highway through Decatur. The sampling showed an overwhelming opposition to such plans by Winnona Parkers.

Similar petitions by other Decatur neighborhood groups had already been presented to the commission and at their March 15th meeting, the commissioners voted unanimously to reaffirm its opposition to such plans.


### neighborhood watch

The idea of an organized "Neigh-borhood Watch" has been considered by WPNA for the last six months. The one meeting which was held on the subject did not draw big crowds; however WPNA has had many inquiries about the program from people who were interested but could not attend the meeting.

A Neighborhood Watch on the order of the DeKalb County THOR program involves street by street organization with one person on each street serving as a block captain. A list is made up of everyone on the street and all are encouraged to take certain safety measures (engraving valuables, for ex.). Printed materials on safety measures are also provided each family and neighbors watch out for each other.

The big question now is whether there is enough interest for WPNA to sponsor such a program for Winnona Park. THOR requires 75% participation in their program before a neighborhood watch sign is erected. Our program would be through the Decatur police department but this indicates the amount of support such a program needs. To start, WPNA would need a volunteer from each street, preferably someone who is home all day, who will be a block captain for their street. Also needed is a volunteer who would act as a coordinator for the block captains.

You do not have to be active in WPNA to volunteer -- just concerned about crime in our neighborhood. We hope that we will be able to tackle this problem before it becomes more serious but it will require more people becoming involved.
